PREP to Year 1

J65 Small Arrangement Using Vegetable and/or Fruit

J66 Pressed Flowers/Foliage mounted on A4 page

J67 Floral display on Plate or Saucer using wet sand, no more than 30cms

Year 2 to 6

J68 Animal or creature made from fruit and/or vegetable/flowers

J69 “Fairy Garden” or “Dinosaur Garden” (To be made on any water retaining tray, no bigger than 30cm x30cm)

Must include at least one fairy/dinosaur and some use of greenery and/or flowers)

Must include at least one floral element (flower, cactus, leaves) no larger than a 30cm X 30cm or 30cm diameter.

Classes will be decided on the day depending on numbers and ages.

J75 GRASS HEAD

Prize Money: 1st \$6 2nd \$4

Method - Sprinkle some grass seeds into the bottom of a stocking foot and fill it with potting mix or sphagnum moss. Twist the stocking until it is the shape and size of tennis ball, and then tie it off leaving about 10cm dangling down at the bottom.

Use an elastic band to make a bulging nose in the stocking face.

Give your grass head a face, glue on googly eyes, pipe cleaners for eyebrows and any decorations you like. Half fill a small container (eg Yoghurt container) with water and place the head on top, so the stocking tail is dangling into the water. Use a spray bottle of water to moisten his head.

Place him on a windowsill that gets plenty of sun. Check each day to make sure the stocking head remains damp. A full **head of hair takes** 3-4 weeks to **grow**, and “greying and balding” **will** occur after about 6 weeks.
